This course presents basic constitutional concepts, government structure and operation. Basic rights and duties of the people. 2. Oral presentations on topics related to the course are presented by student groups on a rotating basis. 3. Student understanding of government structure and civil rights and duties is cultivated in order to improve student grasp of the democratic rule of law, with the goal of molding modern citizens. 4. The course also introduces students to further methods and means of research through lectures and presentations on the content of the course, supported by readings in other scholars' work and study and discussion of similar systems and philosophies from the past to the present, both native and foreign.</p>

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
